UTILITY BILLING INCONSISTENCIES

After looking at our Bylaw and the Utility Billings for the Residents and Businesses of the Village of Loreburn, it has come to our attention that there are inconsistencies in the utility billing process.

Mainly, according to our Bylaw 3-2012 – can view at office or online at www.villageofloreburn.ca:

- \$15 is the minimum charge for water whether any is used or not, as long as turned on
- \$100 is the charge to have your water shut off at your property
- \$100 is the charge to have your water turned on at your property
- \$15 is the standard sewer charge if your house is connected to the sewer system, whether the house is occupied or not (includes gone on vacation or summer residents).

Effective for the month of March 2015 utility billing:

WATER

Every person that owns a property that is connected to the water system, will pay \$15 minimum plus overage based on usage, as long as your water is ON at the curbstop. If your water is OFF at the curbstop, you will not be charged. However, when your water is turned ON at the curbstop, the charge is \$100 for the connection PLUS \$15 minimum per month plus overage based on usage.

SEWER

Every person that owns a property that is connected to the sewer system, will pay \$15 per month.

WASTE/RECYCLING

Loraas Disposal has given us the opportunity to have a different rate for vacationing/summer residents: If you have waste and/or recycle bins on your property that are not in use for more than one month, you can let Brandy know at the Village Office, and your monthly rate for waste/recycle would be reduced to \$5 per month. Your bins will not be picked up during this time. Please let Brandy know once you are home so that your bins will be picked up and your rate changed.

Every property owner that has a bin for that property, must either have it on vacation hold, in use or the village can have it removed from your property. If it is removed from your property, we will not store these bins so they would be returned to Loraas Disposal. If you are in need of one in the future, there would be a wait time until a bin can be brought out. As long as there is a bin on your property, whether you use it or not, there will be a minimum charge as stated above.
